

PLANNING PRINCIPLES

The Visionary (re)Generation Master Plan is guided by six main principles, established through collaboration and engagement, and positioning the campus to be a place that is:

- **Connected**, networking the campus and connecting to the city
- A **Destination**, offering reasons to come and reasons to stay
- **Sustainable**, functioning as a living lab
- A **Community** built for density and designed for people
- A leading example of **Indigenous Design & Planning**
- And finally, **Transformative** in terms of research, learning, working, and living

The principles are supported by twelve design objectives and tied together by the concept of interdependence, meaning that they are interconnected pieces of the campus and of our vision for its future. An Indigenous way of seeing/being that recognizes the interdependence of all things underlies the Plan and connects its principles together.

An effective plan must recognize that all components of a place – such as the land, water, transportation networks, buildings, infrastructure, open spaces, and the people that inhabit it – are linked in complex ways. Each one affects the other, and they must be viewed holistically.
